



Interpreting an image

Time travel mission

Look and read

Ask students to look at the picture and to say what they can see (a sarcophagus). Ask them which civilization used them (the Ancient Egyptians) and what they were used for (to bury Egyptian pharaohs). Then, ask them what type of scientists have found sarcophagi (archeologists) and where (inside pyramids). Finally, ask them where we might find a sarcophagus today (in a natural history museum).

Students read the first part of the story (texts 1-7). This could be done as individual reading practice or you could ask volunteers to read a section of the text out loud with the other students following. An audio version of the story is also available. Words highlighted in blue appear in the glossary.

This activity could be done individually but students will also benefit from collaborative problem-solving. Students look at the hieroglyphic alphabet and decode the riddle written below Hatshepsut (Wrapped like a gift in a painted box. What am I?) Then, they solve the riddle.
